# DISTRICT YOUTH IS APPOINTED AS WEST POINT CADET

**Aaron Bradshaw, Jr., Winner of Honor, Was Awarded Medal in High School.**

Announcement was made today of the appointment by President Taft of Aaron Bradshaw, jr., as representative from the District at the United States Military Academy. Mr. Bradshaw is the son of Aaron Bradshaw, an official of the assessor's office and recent delegate from the District to the Republican national convention.

Mr. Bradshaw was born in Washington, and was educated in the public schools, graduating from the Central High School in 1912. He was the winner of the medal awarded for the history essay in the high schools, and has one of the best records in mathematics of any pupil who was ever graduated from the public schools. His candidacy was strongly indorsed by Capt. James F. Oyster, president of the Board of Education, and Dr. William M. Davidson, superintendent of the public schools.

Mr. Bradshaw was an officer of the cadet corps, being first lieutenant in Company I. His home is at 901 C street northeast.

To young Bradshaw belongs the distinction of being the first appointee under the law providing for the appointment of two cadets at the United States Military Academy from the District.

The present representative from Washington at West Point is William Culver.

Young Bradshaw will appear at the Washington Barracks on the last Tuesday in April for examination.
